





Selection Criteria

- Ratio of externally-evaluated Research Funds: At least 50% of the doctoral candidates in a Consortium are financed by externally-evaluated funded projects (FWF, EU etc.).
- The duration of employment is three to four years. The level of employment amounts to at least 50% (target 75%).
- A Consortium of the Doctoral Academy consists of ten doctoral candidates (recommended number), however, should comprise at least seven candidates.
- The Faculty of a Consortium consists of at least five members
- High-Quality Training programme ensures research-intensive and future-oriented training

Benefits

Member consortia may claim the following benefits:

- funding of max. 50% of the doctoral candidates of a consortium (other 50% have to be third-party funded)
- funding of courses aiming only at doctoral candidates
- funding of the active participation of the Academy's doctoral candidates in events (talks/presentations)
- funding of its members' participation in subject-specific workshops, guest lectures, joint seminars, conferences, summer schools etc.
- provision of an on-demand and tailor-made courses to acquire general transferable skills

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
