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Diverse systems – need for a common framework

- European Higher Education Area: 49 systems from Ireland to Kazakhstan and from Finland to Malta
- Diverse academic and quality assurance cultures and traditions
- Objective: easy student movement across the area, with recognition
- Quality assurance as proxy for trust



Key elements of the EHEA QA framework

- The ESG (Standards and Guidelines for QA in the EHEA)
 - Since 2005, revised in 2015
 - Written by the stakeholders, approved by ministers
 - Generic standards provide a shared framework for QA in Europe
 - A success story of the Bologna Process, powerful tool to implement policies
- European Quality Assurance Register (EQAR)
 - Since 2007
 - Independent register of ESG compliant QA agencies
- European Approach for QA of Joint Programmes
 - Since 2015
 - A set of ESG based standard and methodology for QA of joint programmes
 - One procedure instead of many (conflicting) ones

A common set of standards for IQA and EQA



Standards and Guidelines for Quality Assurance in the European Higher Education Area 2015 (ESG)

- Three parts covering standards for quality assurance, not quality
 - Internal QA within HEIs
 - External QA carried by QA agencies
 - QA of QA agencies
- Focus on learning and teaching in HE, including
 - Learning environment
 - Links to research and innovation
