TandEM survey – higher education access barriers for migrants in Southern Europe

Thank you for your interest in contributing to the TandEM project. This survey should take no longer than 10 minutes to complete.

The TandEM project (Towards Empowered Migrant Youth in Southern Europe) is lead by the International Organisation for Migration (IOM) in partnership with EUA and COREIS Italian. It aims to improve higher education integration of third country nationals (TCNs) regardless of their legal status in the country, and to contribute to making societies in Croatia, Cyprus, Greece, Italy, Malta and Spain more socially inclusive.

The focus of this survey is to gather information on the barriers faced by the target group of non-EU (potential) students when accessing higher education in the target countries. In this regard the survey refers to three groups specifically, and applies the following definitions - unless specified otherwise:

- Third country nationals (TCNs): any migrant from third countries, i.e. from outside the EU.
- **Refugees:** for editorial reasons the survey uses the term *refugee* to include a range of different status TCNs that are currently seeking or have already received a legal protection status in one of the target countries. These may include persons with a full refugee status, with subsidiary protection or similar status, asylum seekers and all of those in a refugee-like situation.
- **International student:** in the realm of this study, unless specified otherwise, the term international student is used exclusively for students from third countries (outside the EU).

All data received from the questionnaire will be published in aggregate form only. Individual answers will remain anonymous and cannot be traced back to you or your institution. Please click here to view the GDPR general data protection rules for the TandEM survey.
