

## Getting to the 2026 EUA- CDE Annual Meeting

### By Air to Dublin or Shannon Airport

#### From Dublin Airport:

##### From the arrivals hall, Terminal 1:

- Walk straight toward the multi-storey car park & through the pedestrian passage.
- Follow signs for the Bus & Coach Park (the bus parking is located behind the airport chapel).
- Bus zones are numbered by operator—check your ticket for the correct zone.
- [Citylink](#) to Galway usually leaves from Zone 11.
- It's recommended to pre-book your [Citylink](#) ticket online; tickets can also be bought at the stop.

##### From the arrivals hall, Terminal 2:

- In arrivals hall go through the covered glass corridor linking T2 to T1
- Follow the same route as from T1 toward the Bus & Coach Park.

#### From Shannon Airport:

##### From the arrivals hall:

- Follow the signs for Buses & Taxis outside the arrivals area.
- The [Bus Éireann](#) Route 51 / X51 stops directly outside the terminal and goes to Galway City.
- Tickets can be bought on board (cash or contactless) or booked online in advance (recommended)
- Buses run roughly hourly from early morning until 8-10pm depending on the day and season.
- If you arrive after 10pm, your only options are a taxi or car hire, both of which are more expensive than the bus.

#### By train:

You can also arrive in Galway by train.  
Trains start in [Heuston Station, Dublin](#) (40 minutes by bus from Dublin Airport) and arrive into Galway ([Ceannnt](#)) Railway Station.

#### Taxis

Taxis in Galway are always available in Eyre Square. Taxi apps include [FreeNow](#) & [Uber](#).

#### Photography



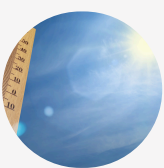
