25 years of shaping European higher education and research

The European University Association (EUA) has advocated for universities' interests and underlined their crucial role for Europe's society and economy since its creation. This year, EUA turns 25. To celebrate this occasion with its members and partners, EUA will organise a conference and evening reception in Brussels on Thursday 29 October.

The anniversary conference will take place from 9:45-16:30 CET at the Royal Library of Belgium and will explore '25 years of shaping European higher education and research'. The event will shine a spotlight on key moments in European higher education and research since 2001, EUA's constructive role in supporting university communities and what the future holds for the Association and its members.

10.00 – 11.00	25 years of impact and influence For a quarter century EUA has supported universities and shaped their environments. From institutional transformation to national policy discussions and the European agenda, panellists will explore where EUA's impact on European higher education and research has been most strongly felt. The session will also address how the Association has bridged the realities of university life and the evolving ambitions of EU policy makers over the years.

11.30 – 12.30	Trends 2027: mapping the latest developments in higher education and shaping EUA's future advocacy EUA is preparing to celebrate the tenth edition of its flagship Trends report. First launched in 1999, Trends is a key resource for mapping institutional developments and reforms in European higher education, enabling EUA to represent universities' views and perspectives in European and national policy debates. This session will present highlights and preliminary findings from the Trends 2027 survey and discuss them with a longitudinal approach.

13.20 – 14.30	EUA's influence in higher education, research & innovation Fireside chats 1. Universities, the Bologna Process & EUA Since its launch in 1999, the Bologna Process has had a significant impact on European higher education. During this period and to this day, EUA has played a constructive role as the voice of universities across the European Higher Education Area. What has this intergovernmental reform process achieved for universities and what are the prospects for the future? How has the role of universities and EUA changed over time and what will it look like going forward? 2. Cultivating robust, diverse & collaborative academic cultures What are the values, incentives and institutional practices that shape academic environments and support integrity, collaboration and inclusion? This session will explore efforts to strengthen academic cultures in Europe from the perspective of universities and the work of EUA on their behalf. Building on initiatives such as the Coalition for Advancing Research Assessment (CoARA), panellists will also consider how reforms to research and academic career assessment can contribute to broader cultural change.
14.30 – 15.30	EUA's impact and added value for universities Parallel thematic sessions 1. Open knowledge & cooperation What does openness in higher education and research mean in practice, why does it matter, and how it is expressed through universities' strategies and everyday activities?

	Openness underpins the free exchange of ideas, academic freedom, international cooperation and the creation and sharing of knowledge as a public good. Yet translating openness into practice requires continuous engagement. Supporting its member universities as they navigate the challenges and opportunities of open knowledge and collaboration is central to EUA's work across a wide range of topics. This includes long-standing priorities such as Open Science, as well as areas that have emerged or gained prominence such as the European Universities alliances or knowledge security. 2. Strategic governance & sustainable funding This session will reflect on how EUA has helped shape national-level advocacy over time. Drawing on its extensive work on university autonomy and funding, it will explore how the Association's comparative evidence base has brought greater structure to national reform debates and supported more coherent policy dialogue across Europe. Looking ahead, the panellists will consider how these collaborative approaches can continue to strengthen the university sector's voice in a rapidly evolving policy landscape. By combining national experience, comparative data and examples of effective practice, from long-term reforms to recent initiatives, the session will highlight how collective action can reinforce institutional resilience and shape the future of European higher education.
15.40 – 16.00	The road ahead Concluding session The conference will conclude with a joint reflection on what lies ahead for universities, higher education and research in Europe and what role EUA should play into the next decade.
